

HOW TO MAINTAIN WINDSCREENS



Maintaining your windscreen is crucial for its longevity and professional appearance. Follow these simple maintenance steps to keep your windscreen looking fresh and clean:

1. Regular Cleaning

- Hose off the windscreen periodically to remove dirt and debris.
- Clean with a mixture of warm water and soap. Avoid using pressure washers or cleaning products containing chlorine or bleach to prevent discoloration or deterioration.

2. Inspect Attachments

- Regularly check all grommet attachments to ensure they are secure. This helps prolong the life of the windscreen.
- After high winds or storms, inspect for any loose attachments and re-tension them to avoid damage from "wind-whip".

3. Repair and Maintenance

- Promptly repair any cuts or holes using Tear-Aid to prevent them from enlarging over time.

4. Weather Preparedness

- After any weather incident, inspect the windscreen for damage and ensure every grommet is attached to the fence. If any grommets are detached, reconnect them promptly.
- If severe weather is imminent, either remove the windscreen entirely or release the bottom and sides, roll up the panel, and fasten it along the top.

5. Winter Storage

- If storing for the winter, hose off the windscreen and allow it to dry completely before storage.

6. Longevity

- Windscreens should last 5 to 7 years with proper care. Review and replace them sooner if required.
